‡ 2. **Grief Workshop** **Fr. Bee & Ellen Schmidt** # attending \_\_\_\_\_

Grief is the most common experience in life yet we have little understanding of it and little permission to express it. The goals of this class are to identify the many different causes of grief, the different types of grief, myths associated with it, normal grief as well as complicated grief, the ways to be supportive to others as well as to yourself and how your faith may help you through this experience. This class is appropriate for everyone. It is hoped that those who are experiencing some form of loss and those who have gone through the process will enrich the class through the sharing of their experiences. It is not required however.

‡ 3. **Dialogue with Scripture** **Judy Kile** # attending \_\_\_\_\_

This class is an invitation to engage in a dialogue with the scriptures, with God, and with each other.

During the 5 week course we will explore different ways to study and discuss scripture. Bring your favorite Bible to class.

We will be using materials from the booklet "Biblical Arts and Crafts Festival". Activities may include cooking, pottery, and stitchery. Meetings will consist of discussions comparing life today with life in Biblical times, and hands-on activities, which may involve using large stitching needles and kitchen appliances.

This class is most appropriate for children who will be able to stay on task and participate in discussions.
